The May issue has been published, and (at the time of writing) sent out to distributors: many thanks to Jacqui and Trish, distributors, - and those who have stepped in for a couple of distributors who are self-isolating: A downloadable e - copy is attached to the notices email, also posted on the church web site (for those who have computers and can download it to read, who would normally pick up their copy at Church), but if you have not received a copy by one of these means and would like to have a printed one please contact Trish, who will arrange for one to be sent out to you.

Here is a message about Foodbank from Andrew Craig...

Hartlepool Foodbank's transition to a "delivery" model has worked very well. We are indebted to British Gas for making vans and drivers available for this service. The first 2 weeks of operation have been remarkably free from unforeseen problems. We are very grateful for this. Foodbank is still "open" over Tuesday and Friday lunchtimes with a skeleton staff, mainly to prepare food packages for delivery and also to receive any donations. Strict social distancing is being maintained. We continue to prepare packages in our warehouse for the Council, partly to fulfil vouchers for emergency food relief that they give to clients, and partly to make resources available to other individuals and families they consider to "vulnerable" or needy during the current crisis. Most of the food for the latter is provided separately by the Council but donations are still needed, and these are directed to those needing emergency relief.

We would like to do something additional to help families with small (mainly pre-school) children that are finding the lock-down difficult for want of entertainment or stimulation for the children. Please would you make people in your congregations aware that we would like simple jigsaws, colouring or painting sets, toys or other educational games to give to families. Offerings should be new (or as new) - no used toys, broken boxes or missing pieces, please. They could be brought down to the foodbank, 28 Church Street on Tuesday or Friday (11:00-1:30).

Please keep praying and encourage people to continue their wonderful support.

FIRST READING

Acts 17: 22-31 (NIVUK)

²² Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: 'People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. ²³ For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship – and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.

²⁴ 'The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. ²⁵ And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else. ²⁶ From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. ²⁷ God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. ²⁸ "For in him we live and move and have our being." As some of your own poets have said, "We are his offspring."

²⁹ 'Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone – an image made by human design and skill. ³⁰ In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. ³¹ For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead.'
