

⁸ Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. ⁹ The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet," and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbour as yourself." ¹⁰ Love does no harm to a neighbour. TWO SERVICES TO RETURN FROM SUNDAY 13 SEPTEMBER

Attendance at Sunday Service in August grew to near capacity under social distancing arrangements and the PCC has agreed that from **Sunday 13 September** we are to hold two services on Sunday mornings in Stranton.

At 9.00am we will hold a said communion service (BCP 1662 alternating with order 1). We anticipate this will be a quiet service with plenty of room for social distancing. The usual instructions (below) will apply. The service will be projected on screens so service booklets will not be used

At 11.00am we will alternate between a less formal Holy Communion service and Morning Worship. There will be some live worship songs from the music group (see details below). We want to welcome all ages to this service. Sunday club will restart on Sunday 27th September and will be held fortnightly. The Sunday Club leaders will be in contact with our regular families with more details before we start. **The 11 am service will also be streamed live on facebook, and be available to view via the Church website or facebook afterwards..**

ENSURING SAFETY IN ATTENDING WORSHIP

Please read the following guidance carefully if you are coming into Church for Sunday worship: online "streaming" services are also continuing so we do not want people to feel under any pressure to come, especially those who may be most at risk. If you are a recent COVID!9 contact or in isolation for health reasons you should not to come to Church.

Enter Church by the south door (usual entrance) but the West (Choir vestry) door will also be open and the pews on the north side are recommended for those who wish to take particular care in distancing.

- Everyone is required to maintain social distancing as well as sanitising their hands on entry and exit. A register of attendees will be kept for three weeks (for tracing purposes only). Please give your name so it can be entered onto the register.
- Please follow the directions of sidespeople and the "one way" arrows
- Maintain 2 metre distancing – families / households may sit together
- The use of face masks inside the building is now mandatory during attendance for services of worship.
- The words for Sunday service will be displayed on the screens.
- Although songs/hymns will be played there will be no congregational singing.
- Sunday club is not operating until 27 September, so Children will need to stay with parents: pick up an activity pack at the door if your child wants one.
- at the end of the Service please meet outside and/or socially distanced to meet and talk, please do not obstruct the way for others to leave safely.
- Your seat will be sanitised after use.
- Access to the toilet is available if necessary, but please try to avoid using, and sanitise all surfaces touched after use in accordance with the instructions on display.

If you become unwell with COVID-19 like symptoms within the week after attending a church service please advise a member of the clergy or a churchwarden so that the contact list information from that service can be used for test and tracing purposes.

MUSIC: The PCC has agreed to have some live music in church from this Sunday. Current Diocesan guidance is that only small groups of musicians are permitted - so for now the congregation will continue to 'sing in their hearts rather than with their mouths'. Please also feel free to stand, clap or move in a way that allows you to express worship.
